## **Message from the Headteacher**

The first half of the summer term has flown by. The children are all coming to the end of their current year groups and preparing with their teachers for the move to a new year group in September. This half term has seen many curriculum activities, class trips and sports competitions and I am sure that both the pupils and staff are ready for the half term break.

## **Alexandra House – building works**

The building works at Alexandra House are reaching a final phase. The project is being completed on a phased basis. The first phase of works, on the northern end of the building is due to complete at the end of June. The second phase of the building, to the southern end will complete in July. The project will end with the redevelopment of the external areas. The building team should complete the project 4 weeks behind the original schedule set last autumn. Given the size and complexity of the refurbishment the delay, which came about at the start of the project with the preparatory works, is not too great and I am pleased that the rest of the works have remained on deadline.

## **Alexandra House – Arrangements for September 2015**

We are currently devising the arrangements for class allocations and daily routines across both sites for next September. Next half term we will share the plans with you all.

## **Road Closure Consultation**

Earlier this week the Local Authority opened a consultation on proposals to create a road closure on Albany Road. In effect this would create a route between the St Paul's site and the Alexandra House site without a road crossing. For local residents it should also reduce traffic flows on Albany Road and make the gate to the St Paul's play area in the park much safer. I have attached the consultation letter and plan to this newsletter.

Please do send a response to the local authority as it will help to build a case for introducing this closure. The more responses the authority get, the more likely the scheme will go ahead.

## **Day of Sport – June 16<sup>th</sup>**

On Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June we shall be holding our second 'Day of Sport'. Children will come to school in their PE kits on 16<sup>th</sup>. The purpose of the day is to promote healthy living and active lifestyles. The children will take part in a range of sports and physical activities over the day, including making fruit smoothies on a 'smoothie bike'. Last year's event was great fun and I am sure that this year will be even better. Details of how to follow up with these activities and to join local clubs will be shared on the day.

Our traditional sports days will be held later in the term as usual.

## Parentpay

Parentpay is now operational. I am very grateful to you all for working with us on the introduction of this electronic payment system and I hope that you are finding it easy to use. The school's office team are happy to resolve any problems or to give mini-tutorials for anybody having difficulty with the system. Our gardening competition started at the beginning of this half term. Throughout the schools window ledges and sun spots have been filled with seed trays.
