Sports Premium Report 2013-14

In April 2013, the Department for Education announced new funding of £150 million through a new 'Sport Premium' to support the delivery of PE and school sport. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and on increasing participation.

Funding is being allocated to all state-maintained secondary, primary, middle and special schools. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has, our school received £.

At St Paul's CE we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

We are using our Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and Sport provision in the following ways:

- To provide high quality PE teaching across all strands of the PE curriculum.
- To raise the profile of sport/physical exercise within the school community – increasing opportunities to participate in a wide range of physical activities and maximising opportunities celebrate/recognise physical activity.
- To increase participation in intra- and inter- school competitions and to develop a wider range of extra-curricular sports opportunities for pupils.

All of the above will motivate, engage and challenge our children in PE.

The money has contributed to the school's overall P.E budget as outlined below.
