## **Music – Peripatetic Lessons**

Peripatetic Instrument lessons start next week. Ukulele lessons start on Monday and Brass lessons on Friday. Miss Vanos, our music subject leader, has sent letters to all pupils enrolled for lessons this week. The Year 5 and 6 after-school ukulele groups will go ahead. Miss Vanos will send confirmation letters to

these pupils today. Peripatetic lessons are led by tutors from Hounslow Music service. There are 10 lessons per term.

### **Reading Workshops for Parents**

We have planned a series of workshops for parents to explain how we teach reading and how we can work together to share our passion for reading. During the workshops we shall share information about book choices, using the reading record and helping your child to develop into a keen and avid reader who has a deep understanding of the texts that they read. **To try and make the meetings available to as many parents as possible we have changed the plan. The morning AND afternoon workshops will be open to parents of children from Year 1 to Year 6.
