

Assessment Outcomes:

Attainment

The percentage of KS2 pupils who achieved level 4 or more:

Reading 93% Writing 89% Mathematics 93%

The percentage of KS2 pupils who achieved level 5 or above

Reading 64% Writing 39% Mathematics 54%

Progress

The percentage of pupils who have improved by 2 or more levels between key stage 1 and key stage 2:

Reading 96% Writing 96% Mathematics 92%

Explanation of terms:

Key Stage 1 This is the stage in school often referred to as infants. This

includes year groups 1 and 2. A child usually enters Y1 in the

academic year that they will turn 6.

Key Stage 2 This is the stage in school often referred to as juniors. This

includes year groups 3,4,5 and 6. A child usually enters Y3 in the academic year that they will turn 8. At the end of Key stage 2

children leave primary school for secondary school.

Level 4 This is the assessment level that the 'average' child is expected to

reach by the end of key stage 2.

Level 5 This is the next assessment level up. Children achieving level 5 or

6 at the end of key stage 2 can be considered to have above

average achievement.

Progress The national expectation for the 'average' child is that they have

moved two levels between leaving key stage 1 (Year 2) and

leaving key stage 2 (Year 6).
