### **Internet Safety Workshops for Parents**

**Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> January @ 3:45pm & Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> January @ 9:15**

Mr Johnston, our Computing subject leader, will be running two workshops on internet safety for parents. Internet safety is a significant issue in our school and I am seeing increasing numbers of problems arising out of the inappropriate use of internet enabled devices in our school community. Please make every effort to attend one of these workshops.

### **Internet Safety Day- Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> February**

On Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> February we shall be marking Internet Safety Day. Pupils will explore internet safety in class with their teachers.

### **Year 6 Bikeability – Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> – Friday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2020**

Our Year 6 children have the opportunity to develop safe cycling skills as part of the Bikeability programme. This training will take place later this month. ### **Mobile Phones**

We shall be changing the school rules on mobile phones from Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> February 2020, once we return from the half term break.

Internet enabled phones (smartphones) and other internet enabled devices (smart watches and other wearable technology) **will no longer be allowed in school**. These devices are not necessary for communication and are being used poorly by some members of the school community.

A traditional 'brick' style mobile phone will still be allowed for children in Years 5 and 6 only. Children in younger year groups are not allowed to bring mobile phones to school. This type of phone is the most basic mobile phone which can be used to telephone and text, but without the ability to use the internet. An example of this type of phone is: Nokia 3310.

We will permit these phones so that pupils can contact their parents if they are travelling to and from school alone. Mobile phones are not permitted to be on or used during the school day. Children will still be expected to turn their phone off at the start of the school day, store their phone in their bag during the school day and then turn it on as they leave the school premises. The school cannot be responsible for the safe keeping of mobile phones during the school day.

Changing our rules in this way brings us into line with many of the high schools in the locality. It also means that children are not carrying very expensive devices which can be lost or which can put them at risk of being mugged.

If a child is found to have a smartphone or other internet enabled device or is found to be using a basic mobile phone during the school day, we shall confiscate it and will only return it to the parent of the child.

### **Appointments during school time**

Medical appointments during the school day can be very disruptive for the school and for children's learning. Please arrange for all routine appointments for doctors and dentists to take place after the school day or during the school holidays.

Absence for passport applications and other types of appointment are not authorised during the school day. Again, appointments for these activities should be organised at the end of the school day or during holiday periods.

### **World Book Day – Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2020**

Later this term we shall be marking World Book Day with a number of special activities in school. Children will be encouraged to come to school in a costume influenced by a favourite book or character. There will be more details of this event nearer the time.

### **Driving to and From School**

Where at all possible we encourage our families to walk, scoot, cycle or use public transport to get to school. Many of our families do so and I am very grateful for this. It is good for the local environment and therefore good for our school. However, I appreciate that for some families driving to or from school may be the only way they travel to school.

If you have to drive to school please avoid driving down Albany Road. The road closure at the end of Albany Road makes turning a car at drop off or pick up time a very difficult and dangerous operation. Albany Road also gets very congested and so traffic to our school can disrupt our near neighbours – something we wish to avoid.

Similarly, please do not pull up at any of the school gates and drop your child from the car door. This causes congestion and can be very dangerous.

Many parents use the Morrisons car park and then walk their children to the school gate. Customers of the store get up to 2 hours free parking in the car park. The parking bays on Latewood Road are part of the local controlled parking zone, but do not operate until 10am (10am-12pm & 6pm – 8pm), so you can park without restriction in the CPZ to drop off and pick up your child. Please, if you drive to school, park your car safely and make the final few metres of your journey on foot for the safety and wellbeing of the whole school and our local community.
