We shall have a themed mufti-day, with contributions on the gate to the school's fund. We shall have an extra special lunch, chosen by the pupils, that will be offered to all packed lunch children to purchase – do look out for the letters in the new year.

Our annual St Paul's week events will take place in the week beginning 22nd January, shortly after our return to school. Year 2 will be leading our special service to which all families and friends are invited on Thursday 25th January at 10 am in the church.

Drop off and Collection Arrangements

Over the last few months we have become aware of increasing difficulties with cars at drop off and pick up. I know that we all want to ensure the safety of all the pupils and families at the school and good relations with our neighbours. There is plenty of parking available in the Morrisons car park and within the CPZ on Latewood Road. The CPZ is not operational during drop off and collection times, so parents can leave their cars safely in these areas to walk their children up to the school gates. The closure at the end of Albany Road makes using the road very dangerous, as any vehicle needs to turn in order to leave the road. With infant and pre-school children at the gate, any turn at the end of the road is very dangerous. I would ask all families not to bring their cars down Albany Road for that reason. Similarly I would be grateful if parents didn't drop their children from the car at the gates to the St Site, but instead parked their cars and walked the children the final part to the gate. This is the best way to keep all children and families safe as well as keeping a safe flow of traffic around the gates at these busy times of the day. If you currently use Albany Road or drop at the gates, please consider my request as a New Years' resolution!

We also have some crowding by the Year 1 gate at collection time. Sadly the positioning of the playground gate means that we have to keep a clearway between the gate and the classroom for older children and families to pass through. If you are a Year 1 parent and arrive once the gate has opened and families have started to wait in line with the gate, please go around and wait behind them for release. If you wish to speak with one of the Year 1 staff, please wait until all the children have been collected, so that the staff can dismiss smoothly and promptly.

I appreciate that drop off and collection times can sometimes be quite fraught, but together we can make them as smooth as possible.
