

### **March 2023**

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

The school calendar can be downloaded to your personal electronic calendar. This includes details of INSET days and muftidays. On some occasions details change or events come together with short notice — we use phone, text or email when this occurs.

We follow local and national guidelines as well as our school policy in respect of school attendance. This can seem strict at times, but we work hard to encourage good school attendance as we know how important it is to children's learning.
