




Section 3 – Feedback on changes to homework as a result of last year's parental survey outcomes


In this part of the survey, we sought statistical feedback on the changes we had made to homework in 2023-24, as a result of last year's feedback. The key changes included:


- Distributing a specific homework folder, to keep homework safe and separate from other communications and resources in children's backpacks/bookbags. In addition easing handing out and collecting in.
- Setting the same days (Friday out/Tuesday in) for homework distribution for all classes across the school.
- Establishing a core set of weekly homework tasks: Reading and commenting in the red reading record, a spelling task/test, a maths homework sheet. Additional homework and learning tasks may be set as relevant to the year group.
- Moving away from generic maths/English homework tasks and setting maths homework directly aligned to the class work.
- Creating standard (school devised) spelling books for Years 1-6, to collate spellings, learning tasks and tests.



Things you Nursery	 Clubs for Year 1 and 2. Inclusion of music and cultures. More music lesson options e.g. piano, strings, recorder, guitar, woodwind More traditional sports, e.g. Clubs for Year 1 and 2. Extra-Curricular Clubs We plan a range of after-school clubs for pupils of all ages. These vary over the year. Some of the clubs are sporting and others are non-sporting. The majority of clubs are for junior children, reflecting the offer of local providers. We shall continue to seek to extend our range of clubs for pupils of all ages in the school. If there are any links that you have with club providers, or if you would like to suggest a particular type of club, please let us know through the school's email.
	football, tennis We teach a weekly music lesson in every year group, using a well-respected scheme of work, recommended by Hounslow Music Service. In addition, we have a universal instrument tuition offer for pupils in year 4. Currently, all Year 4 pupils learn to play the recorder and read sheet music. These lessons are taught by a specialist music tutor from the Hounslow Music Service. We offer peripatetic instrument tuition, currently the ukulele, for pupils in the juniors. We have previously offered peripatetic brass lessons, but take up has fallen. We frequently review our peripatetic offer as local provision evolves. We have an after-school choir for junior pupils. The choir performs locally and has just completed a joint choir project with the Green School Trust and the Blue School. We participate in the National Make Music events. Whilst we have a comprehensive music offer, we are always keen to extend it. We teach a range of sports throughout the school, supported by external providers. Junior children receive expert tennis tuition from coaches from Dukes Meadow tennis.

Medical Appointments We recognise that strong (95%+) attendance is crucial to educational success and wellbeing. We follow national guidance on school attendance. As such, we do not allow leave for routine appointments – check ups, prescription reviews, dental treatment (where a child is well enough to be in school) and other non-urgent medical appointments. These appointments should be made after school or during school holidays. If a child is ill and needs an urgent medical appointment they should not be in school, as they are ill – they do not need permission to attend a GP in these circumstances. There are some rare cases where a child may need to attend a specialist hospital clinic for an ongoing/underlying medical condition. Where a clinic such as this is only held during school hours, we would consider granting leave. In the first instance, we would ask parents to seek to rebook for a working day in a school holiday, where possible. If this is not possible, a leave of absence request, accompanied by the details of the appointment should be submitted well in advance, so that the circumstances can be fully understood when making a decision on whether or not to grant a leave of absence.

I know, from working closely with PFA parents that calls for volunteers and support often go unheeded, making it very difficult to plan with any confidence (even though on the day people are often very willing). I am sure that, together, we can keep PFA events going and I know that the whole community benefits when we have a strong community-focussed PFA.
