#### Introduction




Parental views were also sought by the school governors at a learning review morning in March 2022. The feedback from these interactions is recoded in the learning review summary.

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

We sometimes find that children who have practised past test papers often over perform in practice tests in school, which can give an inaccurate picture of their independent ability.

You are welcome to meet with his teacher at the end of the school day, or speak on the phone about specific areas of maths to practice at home as well. In addition, the <u>maths passports</u> are a good resource to focus on at home as they help to secure recall of number facts. This helps children to gain confidence and stamina.

It would be nice if the kids had more clubs after school to choose. There is very little choice. Club paid during half term would be very helpful.</li> </ul>	We determine the price of our after-school club according to the staffing and resourcing costs. We need to cover the cost of providing this service. We will review the feasibility of running the club until 6pm. Please see the comments above about progress and attainment, as well as the section about tissue in the dining hall. We do not have a holiday club provider that operates out of our school. We share information about holiday clubs across the borough in the Friday Roundup – do keep an eye on the 'External provider' section. If you haven't done this yet, please do.

Our school meal provision is different from many schools, in that we serve meals in dining sittings and through 'family service'. We usually get very positive feedback. Thank you for your feedback. Over the years we have increased shading with the support from the PTFA. We have parasols in the St Paul's Site Playground. We also have some gazebos, which we erect in the playground spaces in sunny weather. Children are encouraged to wear summer uniform, bring a sunhat/sunglasses, wear suncream and have a water bottle. When we have 'heatwave' days we sometimes modify the playtime and lunchtime arrangements to provide an indoor option for pupils. Please see comments above about school meals. Children that have specific dietary needs are usually served directly from the kitchen. At times the preparation of their meal may require a little more time. The Dining Hall Assistants get to know the children's needs and are careful to distribute the meals carefully. Please encourage your child to put up their hand and speak to one of the lunchtime staff if they are concerned. On special occasion days, such as Christmas lunch, Curriculum enrichment days, when the uptake of meals is greater, the distribute the right meals to the right children. They are happy to discuss specific concerns where they arise.

		some of their facilities for sport. We have coaches from local sports clubs, for example tennis tuition from Dukes Meadow, who come and work with the children. In addition, as the COVID restrictions are lifting we are able to use sports venues in other parts of the borough as part of inter-borough sports events and competitions.
