#### **Pupil Premium Expenditure**

The DHT worked 0.5 in class to support pupil premium pupils in English and Mathematics, with years 5 & 6.

A teacher worked with groups of identified Pupil Premium Pupils -0.5 to provide specific support in writing and Mathematics.

A teacher worked 1-1 with infant children on reading and phonics to embed phonic knowledge and develop independent reading. – 0.5

A teacher (pupil premium advocate) worked with groups of early years and key stage 1 pupils running trips in the locality to develop vocabulary, speaking and listening skills, confidence and interest in the learning about the world around us. -0.3

A teacher (pupil premium advocate) worked to signpost Pupil Premium pupils to wider opportunities, building links with CCHF all about Kids and Imperial College outreach programme. – 0.1

Teaching Assistants also worked with identified Pupil Premium Pupils to provide support in English and Mathematics

### **Spending Plan for 2015-16**

- A class teacher to work with groups of identified Pupil Premium Pupils -0.1 to provide specific support in English and mathematics.
- Teaching Assistants also work with identified Pupil Premium Pupils to provide support in English and Mathematics.
- 1 term appointment of additional Pupil premium teacher to support reading in Year 2, phonics in Year 1 and 2, and maths in Year 2 and 6.
- Pupil premium advocate -0.1 to provide enriching educational visits for early years pupils and lower key stage 1.
- A teacher (pupil premium advocate) worked to signpost Pupil Premium pupils to wider opportunities, building links with CCHF all about Kids and Imperial College outreach programme. – 0.1
