<p>Week Beginning: 11/03/24 Key Question: Where does the water go when we flush the toilet?</p> <p>The children will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exploring the water cycle and creating their own water cycle in a cup • Talking about how they use water at home and where it goes when we flush the chain or pull the plug • Investigating puddles and exploring water movement • Using information books to research, and making their own books • Exploring 9 and 10 and identifying different ways to make each number 	<p>Week Beginning:18/03/24 Key Question: Why is water so important?</p> <p>The children will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Investigating how water helps keep things alive • Visiting Kew Gardens and exploring different types of plants found around the world • Creating their own paintings and models of plants using different materials • Investigating why we cannot drink sea water and how water can be cleaned • Finding out about charities which help provide clean drinking water • Exploring 3d shapes 	<p>Week Beginning:25/03/24 Key Question: Why do we celebrate Easter?</p> <p>The children will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finding out about Easter traditions around the world • Reading the Easter story and talking about its importance for Christians • Creating their own Easter cards and crafts using a selection of materials • Creating their own repeating patterns of increasing complexity
