**The school has computers with Internet access to help our learning. These rules will help to keep you safe and be fair to others.**

I will:

- not look at, email, text, or display anything which might offend or upset someone else (pictures, emails, texts or photographs).
- tell an adult straight away if I receive an email or text that contains pictures or writing that I or someone else might find rude or upsetting. (DO NOT DELETE the message – it can be used to find the sender.)
- tell an adult straight away if I find a website that contains pictures or writing that I or someone else might find rude or upsetting.
- not enter an Internet chat room at school (and tell an adult if I do at home)
- understand that my saved school work, emails and files can be checked by an adult at any time.
- NEVER meet up with anyone I only know from using the internet.
- NEVER reveal my home address, telephone number, school name, or picture to anybody on the Internet.
- protect myself by keeping my password to myself, and never use someone else's user name or password.
- always take care to look after ICT equipment (such as laptops or cameras).
- only use the computers or internet for school work.
- not bring or use memory sticks from home without permission.
- never alter the settings on a computer without speaking to an adult first.
- always tell an adult before installing programs of any type on the computers.
- not use someone else's work from the internet as my own. I will always say where I found information.
- speak politely to others when using email
