Statement of intent

During this topic pupils will learn:

- that Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole were both significant historical figures who helped change our approach to medical care –they were the first modern nurses.
- That Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole faced many challenges in achieving their goal
- That Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole both worked in the Crimea during the Crimean War.
- To be able to identify the differences between a modern and contemporary to Florence Nightingale ward
- To identify the impact that Florence Nightingale has had in modern hospitals and care.
- That famous people are commemorated in works of art.
- To make and build a 3D structure to commemorate either Florence Nightingale and/ or Mary Seacole.
