Recording and gathering information about settings- focus on tourist brochure of Verona. Learn and recite key parts of the text. Look at incidents of conflict between characters. Role play as a character and create journal entries (after Romeo's banishment). Write a letter from Romeo to Juliet. Explore the deaths of Juliet and Romeo.
